- *Academic Excellence and Student Success*: Provide support to lead career readiness efforts, including alignment with NAU's Elevating Excellence Strategic Plan, with an emphasis on supporting students and faculty from rural, underserved, and sovereign tribal nations. Includes:
 - Career pathways and pipelines, with collaboration with the Indian Health Service, the Winslow Indian Health Care Center, Area Health Education Centers in Arizona, and the Arizona Advisory Council on Indian Health Care.

- 2021-pres Founder, Social Justice Associates (SJA)**
- *Organizational Strategy, Education, and Training*: At SJA, our mission is to empower people and organizations to thrive through inclusive strategy, culture building, and education. Our work inspires and empowers healthier, more intentional, and inclusive lives in people and organizations. As founder of SJA, I have worked with hundreds of leaders and employees within organizations on strategy building towards inclusive excellence, education, and training (e.g., bias identification, allyship, power, privilege, intersectionality), and conflict resolution. Sample projects include building organization-wide strategic plans through the lens of inclusion for large health care organizations; building master academic plans through the lens of inclusion for college/university campuses; and facilitating conflict resolution among senior executive teams on matters pertaining to inclusion and identity.
 - *Expert Testimony*: Provide expert testimony in cases involving domestic violence, sexual violence, and bias and inclusion. Includes in-person expert testimony in federal- and state- level criminal cases, and in-person expert testimony and expert report-writing in civil cases.
- 2013—2018 Chair, Human Development, College of Social Science, Michigan State University**
- *Faculty Affairs*: Led the department in the implementation of excellence in research, teaching, and outreach, with an emphasis on fostering a research culture coinciding with MSU's initiative to improve research activity. Key faculty affairs processes included: 1) engaging the faculty advisory

committee in re-designing the department's research plan and strategic plan, which outlined our vision, expectations, and resources to ensure faculty success, 2) improving the transparency, clarity and equity of promotion and evaluation processes and salary reward systems, 3) initiating post tenure review and performance agreements (including collaboration with Faculty Affairs and University Counsel), 4) leadership development for tenure- and non-tenure stream faculty, 5) recruiting nationally renowned faculty through inclusive recruitment and start-up packages, and 6) building cross-unit partnerships to extend our success with federal grants.

- ***Faculty Advocacy, Resources and Community:*** Key processes included: 1) augmenting faculty mentoring through monthly support meetings, 2) reducing faculty teaching load from 4 to 3 courses per year to enhance opportunities for research, 3) creating an internal grant review committee and hiring a full-time grants manager to strengthen the quality of faculty research proposals, 4) increasing funds for faculty travel and for hiring external writing and teaching consultants, 5) increasing doctoral student funding from 3 to 5 years to recruit top graduate students, 6) appointing an undergraduate director to work closely with teaching faculty to create an inclusive community of support and learning, and 7) establishing a diversity committee to engage the department in dialogue concerning critical topics.

Key accomplishments resulting from the above activities:

- 720% increase in faculty with federal grant as PI (5% to 41%)
- 648% increase in federal grant dollars (\$401K to >\$3M)
- 118% increase in scholarly citations
- Recruited 7 nationally renowned research faculty
- Significantly increased race and gender diversity of teaching faculty
- Created state-of-the-art learning community among teaching faculty
- Significantly increased leadership opportunities for non-tenure stream faculty, in the roles of undergraduate and graduate directors

- ***Facilities and Capital Planning:*** Led plan in consultation with faculty and staff to improve departmental research and teaching facilities. This included philanthropic efforts and competitive proposals won from the Provost's Office and the Dean's Office to renovate more than 13,000 square feet comprising faculty and staff offices, common workspace areas, conference rooms, along with creating a state-of-the-art statistics and teaching laboratory to support faculty and student work.
- ***Leadership Development:*** In partnership with MSU alumni and college advancement staff, founded the Women's Leadership Institute, a preeminent leadership development source for students, staff and faculty involving evidence-based curricula and networking. The program began for students who identified a need for leadership development, but is inclusive of staff and faculty who report benefits of engaging in the leadership topics covered, e.g., navigating gender bias at the intersection of racial bias.

2018—2019 Special Advisor, Office of the Provost, Michigan State University

- *Faculty Advocacy*: Based on our departmental successes in supporting faculty, I was appointed as a special advisor in the Provost's Office to conduct a university-wide investigation of the supports, challenges and needs of faculty and academic staff. I led a two-phase mixed-methods investigation. In phase one, seven (7) focus groups were conducted with 67 faculty and academic staff. In phase two, using six (6) overarching themes identified in the focus groups, an online survey was developed and completed by 530 faculty and academic staff at MSU (62.76% female; 24.85% non-White) (of 1321 invited, response rate: 40.1%). A report summarizing findings is guiding the redesign of supports for faculty and academic staff. Key themes identified included:
 - Need for holistic involvement of faculty in shared governance
 - Improved job orientation & security especially for non-tenured faculty
 - Need for better mentoring for women faculty
 - Need for improved institutional commitment to URM faculty
 - Improved networking opportunities to reduce faculty's feelings of isolation

2016— Advisor, Academic Advancement Network, Office of the Provost, Michigan State University

- *Supporting Administrators and Emerging Leaders*: Based on my experiences leading a department through large-scale changes, I serve as an advisor to academic administrators (chairs, directors, deans, associate deans) leading their units through similar changes and as an advisor to emerging leaders. Key activities include:
 - Leading panel discussions and on-on-one conversations with academic administrators regarding unit culture change through consensus building, best practices in faculty evaluation and RTP expectations, best practices in evaluating interdisciplinary scholarship, navigating difficult conversations, and strategies for engaging about retirement issues with faculty and academic staff. In these interactions, discussion has focused on giving value and acknowledging differences in promotion and tenure criteria across the disciplines, for example, the arts, humanities, medicine and social sciences.
 - Leading conversations with mid-career faculty considering academic leadership, especially faculty considering department chair and associate dean roles. In these conversations, critical discussion has focused on challenges and strategies for navigating academic leadership at the intersection of gender, race, and LGBT identity.
 - Serving on the selection committee for emerging leaders applying to the Academic Leadership Program—a year-long fellowship program for leaders whose goals are to learn more about becoming dean, associate dean, provost, and president.

2015—2020 Founding Director and Co-founder, Women's Leadership Institute, Michigan State University

The vision of the Women's Leadership Institute (WLI) at Michigan State University is to create leadership equity for women globally. This is achieved through our mission of igniting women

leaders: <https://socialscience.msu.edu/research/centers-institutes/wli/index.html>. WLI is a preeminent source of support in the advancement of students at Michigan State University in their leadership aspirations through evidence-based curricula and networking opportunities with alumni, faculty, and community partners.

- *Programming/Curricula*: Since 2015, developed programming/curricula for students, faculty, staff, and alumni that has engaged more than 400 attendees at each event and hosted student scholarship competitions focused on equity for women globally. Programming/curricula themes range from leading through an equity lens, anti-oppression, gender bias, racial bias, intersectionality, allyship, confidence building, networking and leadership and health and wellness. Our programming/curricula have led to WLI events hosted across the U.S., e.g., NYC, Atlanta, Denver, Tampa, Portland, Seattle, Traverse City, and San Francisco. Following George Floyd's murder, engaged students in three listening sessions with action steps, including an equity scholarship for students on anti-racism social media messaging: <https://socialscience.msu.edu/research/centers-institutes/wli/equity-scholarship.html>. In 2020, forged partnership with the University of Colorado Denver on a social justice teach-in, "*Moving Beyond Statements: the Role of the Public University in the Fight for Racial Justice.*"
- *Fundraising and Alumni Board Development*: Working in partnership with College of Social Science development staff, raised \$3 million dollars in 2018-2020 for the WLI. This included \$1 million through an estate gift for future programming, and \$1 million through a combination of cash and estate gift for a faculty fellowship. In 2019-2020, recruited two additional board members growing the board from 5 to 7 members. New gifts in 2020 have been focused on equity scholarships (\$10,000) and a student equity scholar award (\$50,000).
- *Strategic Planning and Communications*: In 2019-2020, worked with consultant and WLI board through a strategic plan to further develop and refine the mission, vision, and goals of WLI. As well, worked with the College of Social Science Senior Director of Communications to build a comprehensive communication plan and strategy. Encouraged the WLI board to personally support the MSU Blanchard Public Service Forum to show support and continue building relationships across programs.
